Dr. T. Vijender Reddy, Chairman, Governing Body (GB) cordially welcomed all the members and handed over to Dr. JVR Ravindra, Member Secretary for further proceedings.

At the outset, the Member Secretary thanked all the members for attending the meeting and proceeded with the slated agenda.

Section 1: ITEMS FOR CONFIRMATION AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT

25.1.1 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS GB MEETINGS

The GB confirmed the minutes of 24th Governing Body (GB) meeting held on 11-12-2021.

25.1.2 TO NOTE THE ACTION TAKEN ON THE DECISIONS / RESOLUTIONS OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Subject Number 23.3.4: The GB approved the faculty recruitment process and directed member secretary to complete the university ratification process and submit the details in the next GB meeting.

The Member Secretary apprised that, as directed by the GB, the college applied for the ratification of the faculty and 78 faculty members are ratified for the post of Assistant Professor by the JNTUH.

Further, with reference to the JNTUH Circular No. UAAC/SCM/2021 dated 15-11-2021, the college applied for ratification of 27 faculty members for the post of Professor and 3 are ratified.

While discussing the item, University nominee Prof. M. Manzoor Hussain informed that a few more faculty will be considered for ratification in the next review.

The GB noted the same.

Section 2: ITEMS FOR INFORMATION

25.2.1 NATIONAL BOARD OF ACCREDITATION (NBA)

The Member Secretary informed that towards the consideration for further Accreditation of the B. Tech. - CSE, IT, ECE, EEE & ME programmes, NBA informed the college to submit the updated compliance report with the CAY 2021-2022 and pay the fee of Rs. 2,95,000/-. Accordingly, the college has submitted the updated compliance reports on 14-03-2022 and paid the necessary fee. NBA scheduled one day expert committee visit for data verification on 11-06-2022.

The GB noted the same and it is resolved to apply for the accreditation of PG programmes.

25.2.2 NATIONAL RANKINGS AND SURVEYS

The college regularly participates in rankings and surveys conducted by all the apex bodies. The details of the current rankings of the college are mentioned as under.

25.2.2.1 National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)

The Member Secretary apprised that, National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) for Higher Education Institutions was launched in 2015. NIRF now proposes to initiate the ranking exercise for India Rankings 2022, which is its 8th edition.

For the NIRF 2022 ranking, the college submitted data for ranking under Engineering Category, Management Category, Overall Category and for the first time, under the Research Category on 18-02-2022.

The GB noted the same.

25.2.2.2 Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA)

The Member Secretary apprised that, Ministry of Education, Government of India has announced the ARIIA 2021 Ranking Results on 29-12-2021 and with the support and efforts of all the stakeholders, Vardhaman secured "Band-Excellent" (Top 06 to 100 colleges) under Colleges/Institutes (Private/Self Financed) (Technical) Category.

Further, it was informed that, Institution registration process and pre-qualifier submission to participate in ARIIA-2022 ranking is completed and waiting for the data templates from ARIIA.

The GB noted the same.

ARIIA 2021 Ranking certificate is shown as Annexure - 01.

25.2.2.3 Institution's Innovation Council (2020-21)

The Member Secretary apprised that, Under the category of College & Standalone Institutions, VCE undertook various activities prescribed by Innovation Cell, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India to promote Innovation and Start-ups in campus during the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) calendar year 2020-21.

Based on its performance, the college has secured FOUR STAR Annual Performance Rating under College & Standalone Institutions Category.

The GB noted the same.

IIC 2020-21 Rating certificate is shown as Annexure - 02.

25.2.2.4 All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) 2020-2021

The Member Secretary apprised that, the college has submitted data for All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) for the academic year 2020-2021.

The GB noted the same.

25.2.3 STUDENT ADMISSIONS FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022

The Member Secretary submitted the details of number of students admitted and ranks of the students admitted into the first year for the Academic Year 2021-2022.

While discussing the item, Sri. E. S. Chakravarthy expressed his deep concern over getting less number of admissions in ME and CE programmes. It is proposed to conduct a workshop for ME and CE faculty at TCS, Bengaluru to address this issue. While agreeing with him, the members opined that if ME & CE programmes are not offered, the industry may consider the college as a training institute rather than an academic institution. While taking the example of Siddaganga Institute of Technology, Tumkur, Sri. E. S. Chakravarthy proposed to offer the free education to fill the vacant seats to improve admissions in future.

Sri. E. S. Chakravarthy suggested to present road map for AI&ML and AI&DS courses. It is expected that the proposed road map addresses the specific roles Vardhaman student fits in to if core AI, ML and DS companies come for recruitment. It is also opined that, if the college prepares for it now, it would assure sustenance of these programmes in future.

While agreeing with the industry expert, Prof. N. V. Ramana Rao, expressed that NIT Warangal also is in need of domain experts.

Prof. M. Manzoor Hussain, University Nominee informed that, JNTUH is introducing Minors and Honours courses in CSE and allied branches for ME and CE students, in the affiliated colleges.

In continuation, Prof. P. P. Binu seconded the opinion to offer Minors and Honours of CSE and allied branches for the ME and CE students. In response, Member Secretary submitted that, Vardhaman is also offering Minors and Honours, and AICTE LITE programme to the ME and CE students in CSE allied branches.

In connection with the less number of students opting M.Tech admissions, all the members unanimously opined that, the situation is so, due to the job opportunities after completion of B.Tech and there is no much difference in pay packages or job roles offered by the industry between B.Tech and M.Tech graduates.

During the discussion about the admission ranks, the GB opined that, though the highest rank of the admitted student is slightly increased, it is due to the increase of intake of all the premium institutions and expressed their satisfaction.

Student admission details are shown as Annexure - 03.

25.2.4 JNTUH RESEARCH CENTERS

The Member Secretary apprised that, the college has submitted applications for renewal of JNTUH recognition of research centers in the departments of CSE, ECE & ME. After conducting inspection and personal interaction with the honorable Vice-Chancellor, Research Centers in the departments of ME & ECE have been recognised for three academic years (i.e., from 2022-2025). However, CSE Department research center application is still under observation by the JNTUH.

The GB Noted the same.

25.2.5 AICTE LEADERSHIP IN TEACHING EXCELLENCE (LITE) PROGRAMME

While referring to item number 22.3.1 discussed in 22nd GB meeting held on 29-06-2021, the Member Secretary informed that the college is provisionally selected and in process of getting necessary approvals to offer AICTE LITE programme in the college.

The GB Noted the same.

25.2.6 TELANGANA ADMISSION AND FEE REGULATORY COMMITTEE (TAFRC)

The Member Secretary apprised that, in response to the TAFRC notification, the college has submitted the proposals to the Telangana Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee (TAFRC) for the review and determining Fee Structure for the block period 2022-2023 to 2024-2025. The applications are currently under review by the TAFRC.

The GB Noted the same.

25.2.7 STUDENT ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE 2020-2021

25.2.7.1 Academic Year 2017-2021 Batch Students' Academic Performance:

The Member Secretary submitted the academic performance of the 2017-2021 batch students.

The GB Noted the same.

25.2.7.2 Student Academic Progression for the Academic Year 2020-2021

The Member Secretary submitted the academic progression of the students for the academic year 2020-2021.

The GB Noted the same.

25.2.8 PLACEMENTS 2021-2022

The Member Secretary apprised that, a total number of 2025 placement offers are secured so far by the 2021-2022 graduating students with an average salary package of Rs. 6,06,456 per annum with a maximum salary of Rs. 42,66,800 per annum. The placements for this batch are still going on.

Sri E. S. Chakravarthy added that, in next two years industry will ask for gender diversity and advised to work on future plan and present in the next meeting.

While discussing on the item, Prof. N. V. Ramana Rao stressed on the importance of women diversity in the administrative positions. In response, the Member Secretary updated the list of female faculty members working in the administrative positions and submitted that around 32% of the faculty members are female faculty.

The GB expressed their satisfaction on the gender diversity and suggested to start branding on the gender diversity.

25.2.9 BRIEF PRESENTATIONS

25.2.9.1 Presentation by Dean (Academics)

Dr. S. Rajendar, Dean (Academics) presented on the following.

The academic council approved the following items pertaining to curriculum and academic regulations:

- The academic regulations of B.Tech regular degree programme with effect from 2021-2022.
- ii. The academic regulations for Minor and Honour degree programmes with effect from 2021-2022 based on the approval of the affiliating University.
- The academic regulations of M.Tech regular degree programme with effect from 2021-2022.
- iv. The Council reviewed and approved the curriculum structure and syllabus of III and IV year (for the approved regulations of VCE-R20) for UG programmes.
- v. The Council reviewed and approved the four-year curriculum structure and syllabus of I and II year (for the new regulations of VCE-R21) for UG programmes.
- vi. The Council reviewed and approved the two-year curriculum structure and syllabus of M.Tech programmes (for the new regulations of VCE-R21).
- vii. The list of new courses introduced in B.Tech and M.Tech programmes during the revision of syllabus in the AY 2020-2021 and 2021-2022.

Feedback on Curriculum from various stakeholders and Action Taken Report

The Dean (Academics) submitted that certain changes were made in the curriculum based on the feedback on curriculum from various stakeholders and Action Taken Report.

Feedback Collection:

- · Feedback is collected from stakeholders students, faculty, alumni, and employers
- Feedback is collected from internal stakeholders (faculty and students) by conducting meetings periodically and the inputs are recorded.
- Feedback is collected from alumni and employers during their visits to the campus or seek inputs through Placement Officer.

Action Taken Report:

 Action Taken Report is prepared by the concerned Chairman of the BOS and is confirmed with the BOS.

Prof. P. P. Binu enquired about the feedback mechanism being followed at the college. In response, Dean (Academics) submitted the details.

While discussing on the item, the GB advised to encourage students to work on interdisciplinary projects. In response, it was informed that, the college has already created a platform for encouraging interdisciplinary projects through EPICS, etc.

While appreciating the process of stakeholder feedback on curriculum, analysis and action taken process, it was enquired whether the feedback collection is available online. In response, it is submitted that the feedback collection is available online throughout the academic year.

Sri. E. S. Chakravarthy suggested to present metrics on outcomes of curriculum changes made based on the feedback. It is opined that to succeed in the industry, there must be clearly defined differences in the curriculum of existing CSE and newly introduced AI&ML and AI&DS programmes/courses. To help college in this matter, association with *Mu Sigma* will be thought of.

The GB suggested to motivate students to get certified in AWS Cloud / Google Cloud / Microsoft Azure and make it mandatory for slow learners. This will help the college in helping the slow learners to grab placement opportunities. It is advised to focus on creating ability among the students to write algorithms instead of doing projects.

Further, the GB suggested to publish stakeholder satisfaction index on Vardhaman website.

The GB ratified the minutes of 12th Academic Council.

25.2.9.2 Presentation by Dean (R&D)

Dr. J. Krishna Chaithanya presented on the following

- Internal SEED support scheme called VRPS statistics for the last financial years and initiation of VRPS-Graduate Grants for the Financial Year 2021-2022 and sanctioned an amount of 0.27 lakhs.
- Funded research grants for the last three Financial Years, statistics on applied, sanctioned, completed & ongoing projects from Jan 2020 – till date and also discussed about the schemes of ongoing projects under various funding agencies.
- Statistics of publications in Scopus & WoS of last three Calendar Years, that show tremendous growth in Calendar Year - 2022 in terms of enlisting the publications in

- various databases as well as citations and significant improvement in number of publications under SCI/E category.
- The national & international patents filed, published and granted by all departments, involvement of faculty and also about the initiations of procedures to file a patent on the name of college and stated that all the costs borne by the organization only.
- The statistics of income perspective via consultancy works and corporate training of the last two Financial Years and also mentioned that management spent necessary amount towards the facility creation for the upcoming consultancy works & corporate training.
- Awards received by faculty under Research and Innovation areas in the Academic Year 2020-2021 list of the faculty who got enlisted in India Book of Records for the year 2020.
- Future plans of R&D at Vardhaman for the next two years.

While discussion on the item, Prof. N. V. Ramana Rao enquired about AICTE funded projects. In response the Dean (R&D) submitted the details of earlier sanctioned AICTE funded projects.

Sri. E. S. Chakravarthy advised to bring in Consultancy, V-Hub, etc. under one governance. In response it is submitted that, these are already under the Dean (R&D).

While discussing on the item Prof. N. V. Ramana Rao proposed to introduce Maximum Citation Award and the GB resolved to introduce the award.

The GB appreciated the presentation and expressed satisfaction on the progress of the college in the areas presented. The GB advised to present on Industry Sponsored laboratories in the next meeting.

25.3.1 STUDENT SUPPORT

The college regularly awards cash prizes to students for their outstanding academic performance. The college has also introduced Vardhaman Scholarship Test (VST) for the first year B. Tech students.

25.3.1.1 Vardhaman Scholarship Test (VST)

The Member Secretary informed that, VST scheme was announced on 13-07-2021. The First Year B.Tech. students are assessed on the core concepts of the selected courses. Four top performing students are identified and awarded scholarships as follows:

25.3.1.2 Cash Awards to the Student Toppers

The Member Secretary apprised that, as a part of the annual student merit awards given by the IQAC and ISTE, for the year 2020-21 amazon gift vouchers worth of Rs. 1,500/- for the first topper and Rs. 750/- for second topper from I, II & III years of every UG programme were announced. The prize money was equally shared by the ISTE Student Chapter Fund and the Management.

As announced, the prizes were given away to the toppers during the II Year B.Tech Parent-Teacher meeting held on 01-05-2022.

The GB noted the same.

25.3.2 FACULTY SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

The college provides necessary facilities to the faculty in carrying out academic and research activities rigorously. The college recognises the contribution of the faculty and provides them incentives regularly. Besides, all faculty of the college are insured.

25.3.2.1 Faculty API

The Member Secretary submitted that, in view of awarding salary increments to the faculty members a committee consisting of the Principal, Management Nominee, Dean (Academic), Dean (IQAC), Head of the concerned Department was constituted. The committee conducted faculty API

interactions during Aug-Oct 2021. Based on the report submitted by the committee salary increments are given to the faculty from the month of January 2022.

During the API interaction, the committee suggested certain measures to the faculty having low student feedback and inadequate number of publications to improve their performance.

Further, it is submitted that the college is getting associated with deemed to be universities to extend support to the faculty aspiring to pursue PhD.

The GB appreciated the college for associating with deemed to be universities and ratified the item.

25.3.2.2 Faculty Recruitment

The Member Secretary submitted that, faculty recruitment notifications are given in leading national and regional newspapers, in view of maintaining the required faculty-student ratio as per the increased intake and for the immediate filling of faculty vacant positions arising out of faculty resignations.

The applications are scrutinized, shortlisted candidates are interviewed by the internal committee and the required number of faculty are recruited.

The GB ratified the faculty appointments and resolved to recruit the faculty members as per the requirement to maintain faculty student ratio.

25.3.2.3 Adjunct faculty and Emeritus faculty appointment

The Member Secretary proposed to identify and appoint adjunct faculty and emeritus faculty possessing rich experience in both industry and academia.

After detailed discussion the GB resolved to appoint adjunct faculty.

25.3.3 KAUSHAL AUGMENTATION AND RESTRUCTURING MISSION (KARMA) OF AICTE

The Member Secretary apprised that the college has applied and got approval to offer two courses under Model 2 and one course under Model 3 of AICTE KARMA Scheme.

In response to the members query, it is informed that, these are credit-based modular programmes, to be offered as per the vocational trades prescribed in the Samagra Siksha vocational scheme or other NSQF aligned short duration courses which are aligned with the future job/entrepreneurship opportunities relevant to the target group.





B.Tech Honour Degree Programs

Honours Degree Program:

To expand the domain knowledge of the students laterally and vertically, increase the employability, provide opportunity to pursue higher studies in wide range of specializations.

Academic Regulations:

- Student needs to earn additional 20 credits from the additional Courses offered by the host department in the college or from closely related departments as well as from the MOOCs platform
- A student who chooses a Honour program is not eligible to choose a Minor program and vice-versa

 of four years program, he/she will not be eligible for obtaining Honours degree. He
 will be eligible for only B.Tech degree.
